But a reigning Christ, a life changing Christ- that is what is unacceptable to millions of people today. Christ and Christianity appear to be menace to their way of life. It strikes at the root of their independence.

Blessed Virgin Mary is one who responded to God's voice in a different manner. When Mary heard that the Son of the Most High would be born from her by the power of the Holy Spirit, she cried out: "Behold, the handmaid of the Lord! Be it done unto me according to thy word." Her response to the glad news was challenging, yet positive.

Mary's 'fiat' to the angel Gabriel is an 'yes' of the human race to God's gift of Jesus Christ to the world. Her answer was the response of commitment. This is the response I pray we will make at this Christmas!
